

# **COMPETITION MANAGEMENT**

Infield Management Guidelines - Officials May 2022



#### 1. Introduction

European Athletics set the goal to keep the number of working people infield to the most efficient number, which is important for all the intervenient groups to perform their respective tasks in an athletics competition, but mainly for the athletics events to be properly presented and viewed by spectators in the stadium and TV viewers.

Aiming a clean infield concept, these Infield Management Guidelines were created and are mandatory requirements for the European Athletics Indoor and Outdoor Championships. These must be followed as much as possible for all the other European Athletics competitions (events, clubs' competitions and meetings).

It is the responsibility of the Technical Delegate(s), in conjunction with the European Athletics office, to adapt below recommendations, if necessary, based on local circumstances (stadium layout, national judges experience...).

The following groups must be considered for the setting of maximum numbers infield:

- Athletes
- Officials
- Technical team
- Host Broadcaster
- Event Presentation
- Volunteers
- Infield Photographers
- Award Ceremonies (depending on the competition in question but nowadays the tendency for the major championships is for this activity not to take place infield).

There are though other groups that may have to go infield, but only in exceptional circumstances (equipment set up and removal or troubleshooting):

- Timing Company
- Data Processing Company
- Marketing (signage company)
- Medical staff
- Various (technical personnel, etc.)

# In any situation a person required to be infield must ensure staying exclusively for the period required to perform the respective activity.

All people working infield shall wear a Uniform or any other identification provided by the LOC.

These guidelines shall be taken in consideration by the LOC in the planning of a European Athletics Event and shall be the base for the development of the following documents to be presented by the LOC to European Athletics in the preparation of the event:

- <u>Infield layouts per day/per session</u>, including the positioning of the human (officials, athletes, volunteers, photographers' positions, etc.) and material resources (competition equipment, furniture, cameras, boards, timing and data equipment, etc.);
- Stadium plan with the several groups' flows to and from the infield;
- Detailed plan with timing on the equipment set up and removal from the infield.



An **Infield Management Meeting** lead by the Technical Delegates(s), shall take place before the event, and <u>representatives</u> of the following groups must attend:

- Technical Delegate(s)
- LOC Competition Director
- Event Presentation (LOC Manager and EA Consultant)
- Technical Partners
- Host Broadcaster (Producer & responsible for camera positions)
- Photo Chief
- European Athletics Project Leader
- European Athletics responsible for marketing, competition, TV, and media
- Medical responsible person

After the clean infield discussion all concerned must agree on the final position of personal, cameras, boards, technical equipment and any other material infield, as well as the flows. Nothing can be moved without the confirmation of responsible area!

# 2. Infield Management for Officials

The appointments of officials can be divided into 3 groups:

- a) General
- b) Track Events
- c) Field Events

#### Notes:

- Whenever applicable all officials must be seated and as much as possible in a way that the public's visibility is not obstructed.
- Officials on a temporary duty must leave the infield as soon as their duty is finished.
- The figures should not exceed those shown.
- The European Athletics Technical Delegate(s) is/are the only persons allowed to change these figures and only if there is a relevant technical reason.

Infield layout maps per event, including the recommended positioning of all officials listed below are to be found in Appendix 1.

## **EUROPEAN INDOOR CHAMPIONSHIPS**

#### Notes:

- According to World Athletics Competition Rules CR 8.1, the Chief International Technical Official (ITO), in conjunction with the Technical Delegates, shall assign at least one ITO for every event on the programme. The ITO shall be the Referee of each event to which he/she is assigned.
- 2 video referees (one for track and one for field events) will be appointed among the ITOs
- EDM to be used for Shot Put
- EDM may be used for Pole Vault
- VDM to be used for Long Jump / Triple Jump (and for Shot Put, if available in future)
- Countdown clock managed by Secretary via remote control. If technology allows, the countdown clock is to be incorporated into the Field Events Boards (FEBs). In that case, the 'yellow flag' (i.e. showing to the athletes that 15 seconds left before the end of the trial) shall be as well integrated into the FEBs and managed by the Secretary/Data Operator.
- In all field events, there should be the alternative visual means (e.g. via FEBs, other LED boards, 'lighting' tower, etc.) to show valid or invalid trial trials instead of red and white flags. It is still the Chief Judge to decide on the valid or invalid attempt. While the information is to be entered into the system to be visualized via a data operator/secretary. Relevant means of communication are to be provided between the Chief Judge and the data operator/secretary, where needed.

## **EUROPEAN OUTDOOR CHAMPIONSHIPS**

#### Notes:

- According to World Athletics Competition Rules CR 8.1, the Chief International Technical Official (ITO), in conjunction with the Technical Delegates, shall assign at least one ITO for every event on the programme. The ITO shall be the Referee of each event to which he/she is assigned.
- 2 video referees (one for track and one for field events) will be appointed among the ITOs
- EDM to be used for all throws
- EDM may be used for Pole Vault
- VDM to be used for Long Jump / Triple Jump (VDM could be also used for Shot Put or even long throws, if available in future)
- Countdown clock managed by Secretary via remote control. If technology allows, the countdown clock is to be incorporated into the Field Events Boards (FEBs). In that case, the 'yellow flag' (i.e. showing to the athlete that 15 seconds left before the end of the trial) shall be as well integrated into the FEBs and managed by the Secretary/Data Operator.
- In all field events, there should be the alternative visual means (e.g. via FEBs, other LED boards, 'lighting' tower, etc.) to show valid or invalid trials instead of red and white flags. It is still the Chief Judge to decide on the valid or invalid attempt. While the information is to be entered into the system to be visualized via a data operator/secretary. Relevant means of communication are to be provided between the Chief Judge and the data operator/secretary, where needed.

## 3. Infield Management for other categories

### Photographers:

- Maximum 12 simultaneously infield photographers for outdoor and 8 for indoor events (the numbers are to be discussed and confirmed by EA & TD before each individual Championships)
- Media Department to develop before each event a clear detailed plan and map (including Numbers, access and flows, behaviour recommendations, etc.)
- Location of the infield working space (one table) for Photo upload to be agreed in advance with TDs
- Construction to install cameras at field events

### Host Broadcaster:

- Refer to TV Operations Manual

# **Victory Ceremonies**

- Council Decision to have the victory ceremonies stage outside of the competition venue for both Indoor / Outdoor Championships
- For other events, strong recommendation to have the victory ceremonies staged outside the competition timetable and outside of the track
- If not possible, location of the podium to be carefully studied to avoid crossing of the track.

### Medical:

- Refer to Infield Management guidelines for Medical Personal
- Recommendation to find a position for medical staff which is not visible on camera view
- Recommendation to have the anti-doping chaperones located outside the track (and at the end of the mixed zone whenever possible)

#### Data:

- One CIS to be installed on the athletes' benches for all field events (to be included in the infield layouts) – when the Secretary is positioned outside

# Technical Team:

- Technical Management Team should be infield only for set up and the removal of equipment and for troubleshooting.
- LOC competition Management to develop equipment movement plan to be agreed by TDs

#### 4. Equipment

- Start material to be installed outside of lane 8 (6 for indoor events), whenever possible
- Field events boards to be installed outside of the infield for indoor competitions
- Type and size of athletes' benches to be discussed and agreed with TDs and HB
- Type, size and branding of shadow to be discussed and agreed with TDs and HB



# **5. Sector Layout for Throwing Events**

The landing sectors for throwing events should be laid out according to the following guidelines:

- Qualification rounds one yellow arc at qualifying mark and one white reference mark
- Finals 2 white arcs at distances such that:
  - 20% of throws land before the shortest arc
  - 60% of throws land between the two arcs
  - 20% of throws land beyond the furthest arc

Intervals of the arcs for **Shot Put** should be 2 metres. Intervals for all **other Throwing Events** should be 10 metres.
